Athelstan Museum Virtual Talk - "The Pursuit and Sinking of the Bismarck"

Wednesday 5th May 6:30pm

80 years ago, on 24th May, more than a hundred British warships were involved in a desperate 5 day, 1,750 mile hunt for the mighty German battleship Bismarck, which disappeared for more than 24 hours and was almost within reach of safety before it was tracked down. David Bickerton's father was a crewman aboard HMS Dorsetshire which was involved in the final showdown.

Yew hedges divide lawns, borders, rose garden, lily pond and a newer wild area with a natural swimming pond shaded by a liriodendron. Views through large Turkey oaks to farmland beyond. Small courtyard gravel garden. Sculptures are sited throughout the gardens. Unsuitable for wheelchairs.

2m W of Malmesbury. 10 mins from J17 on M4. Turn towards Malmesbury/Cirencester, then towards Norton and follow signs for the Vine Tree, yellow signs from here.

<u>National Garden Scheme - North Cottage, Tisbury Row, Tisbury, SP3 6RZ</u>

Sun 23 May, (11.30-5). Adm £5, chd free. Home-made light lunches and teas Leave car park, walk past vegetables and through the paddock to reach house and gardens. Although modest, there is much variety to find. Garden is divided with lots to explore as each part differs in style and feel, augmented with pottery, woodwork handmade by the owners. From the intimacy of the garden go out to see the orchard, ponds, walk the coppice wood and see the rest of the smallholding. Ceramics, wooden furniture and handicrafts all made by garden owners, including creations from their own sheep's wool for sale. Exciting metalwork sculpture exhibition. Large variety of plants for sale.

12m W of Salisbury. From A30 turn N through Ansty, L at T-junction, towards Tisbury. From Tisbury take Ansty road. Car park entrance nr junction signed Tisbury Row.

National Garden Scheme - Ordnance House, West Dean, Salisbury, SP5 1JE

Sun 23 May (11-4). Adm £5, chd free. Home-made teas in aid of Salisbury Hospice This garden was awarded a RHS Gold Medal in May 2020 in a competition held in conjunction with the BBC One Show. The garden won the 'Back Garden' category judged by a panel incl Monty Don, James Alexander-Sinclair, Sue Biggs (DG of RHS) and One how host Alex Jones. The garden has drifts of white and purple alliums and foxgloves in spring with unusual varieties of lavender in summer. Its design features topiary balls and spheres, a vegetable garden, ornamental parterre and small orchard.

8m W of Romsey, 8m E of Salisbury. From A36 Southampton to Salisbury road follow signs for West Dean via West Grimstead. From Romsey, follow signs via Awbridge, Lockerley & East Dean. From Stockbridge, follow signs from Broughton.

The C15 Manor house comes into view as you descend along the drive and into the Grade II landscaped Edwardian gardens. The extensive plantings that surround the house are undergoing considerable redevelopment by the owners and their head gardener. A wide range of organic horticulture is practiced in 8 acres of relaxed yet playful gardens. Regretfully, very little wheelchair access.

5m SW of Chippenham, 5m NE of Bath. From A4 at Box, A365 to Melksham, at Five Ways junction L onto B3109 towards Corsham; 1st L in ¼m, drive immed on R.

National Garden Scheme - Tristenagh House, Devizes Road, Potterne, Devizes, SN10 5LW

Mon 31 May (1.30-5.30). Adm £5, chd free. Home-made teas. Refreshments in aid of The Wiltshire Bobby Van Trust.

Garden of approx 2 acres, created over the past 20 years. Island beds with a mixture of herbaceous plants, bulbs, annuals and shrubs. All year round structure provided by beech and yew hedges, box topiary and by mature beech and Scots pine trees. Some gravelled areas with containers. Wheelchair access to most parts of garden on grass paths. Access to terrace limited due to gravel. Some steps.

Im S of Devizes on A360. Turn down byway by post-box and cottage (27 Devizes Rd) and follow yellow signs to car park and entrance to the garden.
