**3. Recommendations on answering the questions**

3.1. We recommend that the Town Council strongly agrees with all the objectives listed in the Climate Strategy – as you will know from having read the document, all of the actions are necessary to reduce carbon emissions and to mitigate the worst of climate change already in the pipeline.

3.2. There is little opportunity for free text in the online survey, so some important points to include in the emphasis are:

- The need for more detail about how each of the ambitions will be reached, year on year to 2030 (you will see from the Strategies and targets page that there is no detail, other than the publication of government documents)
- There are references to working with town and parish councils, but this partnership work isn't our experience, so we need to ask for more emphasis on this
- The language is couched in terms that belie the seriousness of the situation: "...aspire for net zero carbon development..." and "...within the constraints of the national planning system..." so it seems there is little of substance in the document. There should be more emphasis on actions, especially campaigning to central government on our behalf to get access to the resources to manifest the ambitions
- Be clear about resource allocation to this strategy – where are resources coming from?

5. Recommendations
