Minutes' Reflection

MAYORS ANNOUNCEMENTS

Cllr James stated that Cllr Sanderson may speak from a sitting position if required. Cllr James had engagements with St Jo's Joseph and the Amazing Technicolour Dreamcoat in the Abbey, Roz Savage MBE MP, Gordon Williams re Town Crier, Photographed on Lime Down site, Malmesbury School Year 8 Science Fair, Business Planning Workshop, Gien Civic Reception and Farewell Dinner, Visited Abbey House, with owner, Malmesbury History Society 10th Anniversary, Malmesbury Community Fridge 3rd Anniversary, Abbey House Manor Open Gardens and a Teams meeting with WC re Riverside in the last month.

Ivan Randall from the Wiltshire Wildlife Trust gave a presentation about the importance of conservation in Churchyards and Cemeteries. Mr Randall thanked the Council for allowing him to speak at the meeting and described other local projects that are working successfully towards conservation in Cemeteries. The Wiltshire Wildlife Trust is very supportive of these initiatives and lend equipment if they are able to. There are many ideas and activities to encourage children to become involved and generate interest from a young age.

Cllr James explained to members that officials from Wiltshire Council had written to the Secretary of State requesting that their previous decision to expand the Primary School be rescinded, this took place without the knowledge of the current administration at Wiltshire Council. Cllr Grant stated that he has received a response to a letter that he wrote to the Secretary of State, noting that the regional division of the education authority is unlikely to change its original view, in favour of the expansion. Questions were asked about projected School figures, if the plan had been forwarded to other local Schools and why WC had changed its original support. Laurence Musset (Chair of Governors) replied that 'satellite' primary schools have been asked how they would like to access the proposed STEAM facility but no responses had yet been received. Mr Musset also stated that WC figures were from October 2024 and that house building numbers are not being projected but the

Malmesbury School is planning for the future and taking current and future developments into account.

Following discussion it was resolved that Malmesbury Town Council supports the proposed expansion as approved by the Secretary of State in 2024.
